#### Definition of juxtaposition

: the act or an instance of placing two or more things side by side often to compare or contrast or to create an interesting effect

// an unusual juxtaposition of colors

also: the state of being so placed

// contrasting shapes placed in juxtaposition to each other

Light and Dark. Hope and Despair. Calm and Chaos. Success and Failure. Strength and Weakness.

Typically, you cannot have the first in the presence of the second. But, during the season of Lent, interesting things happen when opposites are juxtaposed. Lent is a time for self-reflection and penitence, a time to acknowledge our sinfulness and need for God's mercy as we prepare for the celebration of resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Don't worry, Lent is still a month away, but this year, we are going to do something that may be new to many of you, so I want to begin the conversation. Wednesday, March 6, 2019 is the first day of Lent and we will participate in an Ash Wednesday Service in the Sanctuary at 6:30 pm. This service will begin our journey of juxtapositions through the wilderness to the last supper in the upper room to the betrayal to the crucifixion, and then finally to the empty tomb. At the conclusion of the service you will have the opportunity to have ashes imposed on your forehead in the shape of a cross. The ashes will serve as a visible reminder that you are on your journey following Jesus to death and then to life.

If we take it seriously, it will be uncomfortable because we will open ourselves up to vulnerability. We will uncover things we have left hidden. We will wrestle with our sins and the things that keep us from following Jesus more fully. We will come face-to-face with our certain death. Yet, if we take it seriously, we will find renewed life on the journey, and full joy at our final destination on Easter Sunday.

The juxtapositions of mortality and eternity, sin and grace, death and life, make the path of Jesus' cross and tomb a rugged, yet rewarding terrain. I look forward to seeing you on Wednesday, March 6, 2019 at 6:30 pm as we begin this journey of juxtapositions together.

Worshipping together in God's family brings us out of ourselves and into the relief of knowing there is Someone greater than us who is faithful to accomplish His will in our lives, despite our weaknesses. This Sunday we will have the door open and you come just as you are!
